ELIGIBILITY Older adults 60 years and older. Priority is given to those in greatest financial and social need. Eligibility for some services may require the inability to perform cognitive and physical activities.

SERVICES FOR SENIORS

Kaua'i Adult Day Health 246-6919

Provide adult day care services in a supervised, protective and congregate setting during the day.

Caregiver Counseling 245-3200

Counseling to caregivers to assist them in making decisions and problem-solving.

Case Management Program 241-4470

Social work assistance to frail elderly; coordinates community and in-home services.

Better Choices, Better Health 241-4470

An interactive 6-week workshop for seniors with chronic health conditions and their caregivers.

EnhanceFitness 241-4898

An evidence-based, physical activity program designed to improve the overall functional fitness and well-being of older adults.

Nutrition Services 245-4077

Hot lunches at various congregate meal sites and island-wide home-delivered meals to homebound seniors.

Friendly Visiting Program 241-4470

Friendly visits by volunteers to frail elderly.

Grandparents Raising Grandchildren 245-5914

Family caregivers (grandparents) have supportive programs and services that address their needs to enable them to continue giving care.

Home Service Registry 241-4470

Referral of in-home workers who provide services for a fee.

Homemaker 241-4470

Helping frail seniors with housework, meal preparation and other limited in-home services.

Information and Referral 241-4470

Information on senior resources and referral or linkage to appropriate agencies; community outreach to provide information about available services.

Kupuna Care Transportation 246-8110

Bus service available for registered seniors to and from program activities, shopping, clinic, recreation and door-to-door services for frail elderly.

Legal Assistance 246-8868

Legal education, counseling and referral in Medicaid, Medicare, landlord-tenant, creditor, family law and other legal matters. Limited document preparation.

Personal Care 241-4470

Assistance with activities of daily living such as bathing, dressing, grooming, and eating.

Respite 241-4470

Provides caregiver relief by assisting in the supervision and care of frail elderly.

Senior Companion Program 241-4470

Program-qualified senior volunteers provide companionship and assistance to frail, homebound older adults.

Senior Identification Card 241-4470

Photo I.D. available to persons 60 years and older.

Telephone Reassurance 241-4470

Telephone contact by volunteers to isolated elderly.

Volunteer Program RSVP 241-4479

Meaningful volunteer opportunities for persons 55 years and older.
